

1. Getting from the Airport to CUNEF Universidad

Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas Airport is located approximately 12 km (8 miles) northeast of central Madrid. There are several options to get to CUNEF Universidad, including **taxi** or **Metro** (Madrid underground).

By taxi

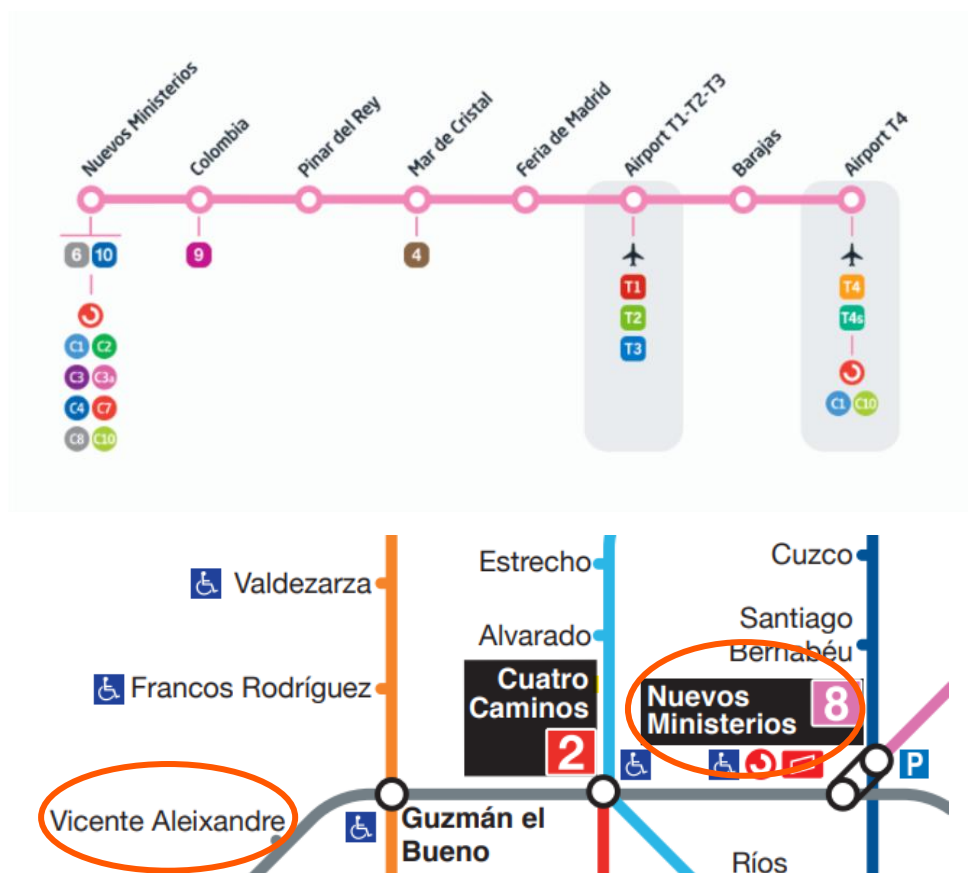
Local taxis have a fixed fare of €33 for trips between the airport and the city. Alternatively, guests may use Uber, Cabify, or a similar service, with fares varying depending on distance and traffic.

The journey from the airport to CUNEF Universidad typically takes 20 - 45 minutes, depending on traffic conditions.

By Metro

Metro de Madrid can be accessed from any of the four airport terminals via two stations located in the airport: **Aeropuerto T1-T2-T3** and **Aeropuerto T4**, both on Line 8 (pink line).

The best way to get from the airport to CUNEF Universidad is to go directly to **Nuevos Ministerios Station** and then switch to Line 6 (grey line) to get to **Vicente Aleixandre Station**.



2. Getting from Puerta de Atocha Train Station to CUNEF Universidad

If you arrive at Puerta de Atocha Train Station, you can reach CUNEF Universidad by **taxi** or by **Metro** (Madrid underground).

By taxi

Local taxis have a fixed surcharge of €8 for trips starting from a train station. Alternatively, guests may also use Uber, Cabify, or a similar service, where the cost varies depending on distance and traffic.

The journey from the train station to CUNEF Universidad typically takes 15 - 45 minutes, depending on traffic conditions.

By Metro

You can reach CUNEF Universidad by Metro by traveling 10 stops on Line 1 (light blue line), from **Atocha Station** to **Cuatro Caminos Station**. Then transfer to Line 6 (grey line) and travel 2 additional stops to **Vicente Aleixandre Station**.



3. Getting from the Airport to the city centre

You can reach the city centre from Madrid Airport by **taxi** or by **Metro** (Madrid underground).

By taxi

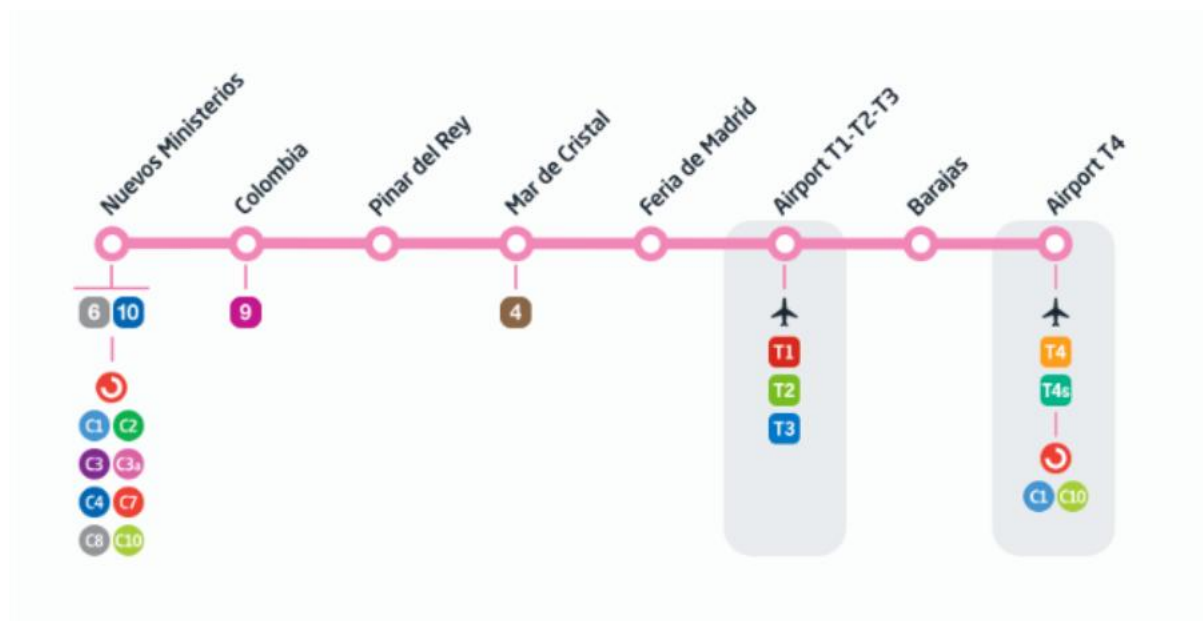
Local taxis have a fixed fare of €33 for trips between the airport and the city. Alternatively, guests may use Uber, Cabify, or a similar service, with fares varying depending on distance and traffic.

The journey typically takes 20 – 45 minutes, depending on traffic conditions.

By Metro

Metro de Madrid can be accessed from any of the four airport terminals via two stations located in the airport: **Aeropuerto T1-T2-T3** and **Aeropuerto T4**, both on Line 8 (pink line).

The best way to get from the airport to the city centre is to go directly to **Nuevos Ministerios Station** and then transfer to other Metro lines.



4. Getting from Puerta de Atocha Train Station to the city centre

You can get from Puerta de Atocha Train Station to the city centre by **taxi** or by **Metro** (Madrid underground).

By taxi

Local taxis have a fixed surcharge of €8 for trips starting from a train station. Alternatively, guests may also use Uber, Cabify, or a similar service, where the cost varies depending on distance and traffic.

The journey from the train station to the city centre typically takes 10 - 35 minutes, depending on traffic conditions.

By Metro

You can reach the city centre by taking **Line 1** (light blue line) four stops, from **Atocha Station** to **Sol Station**.



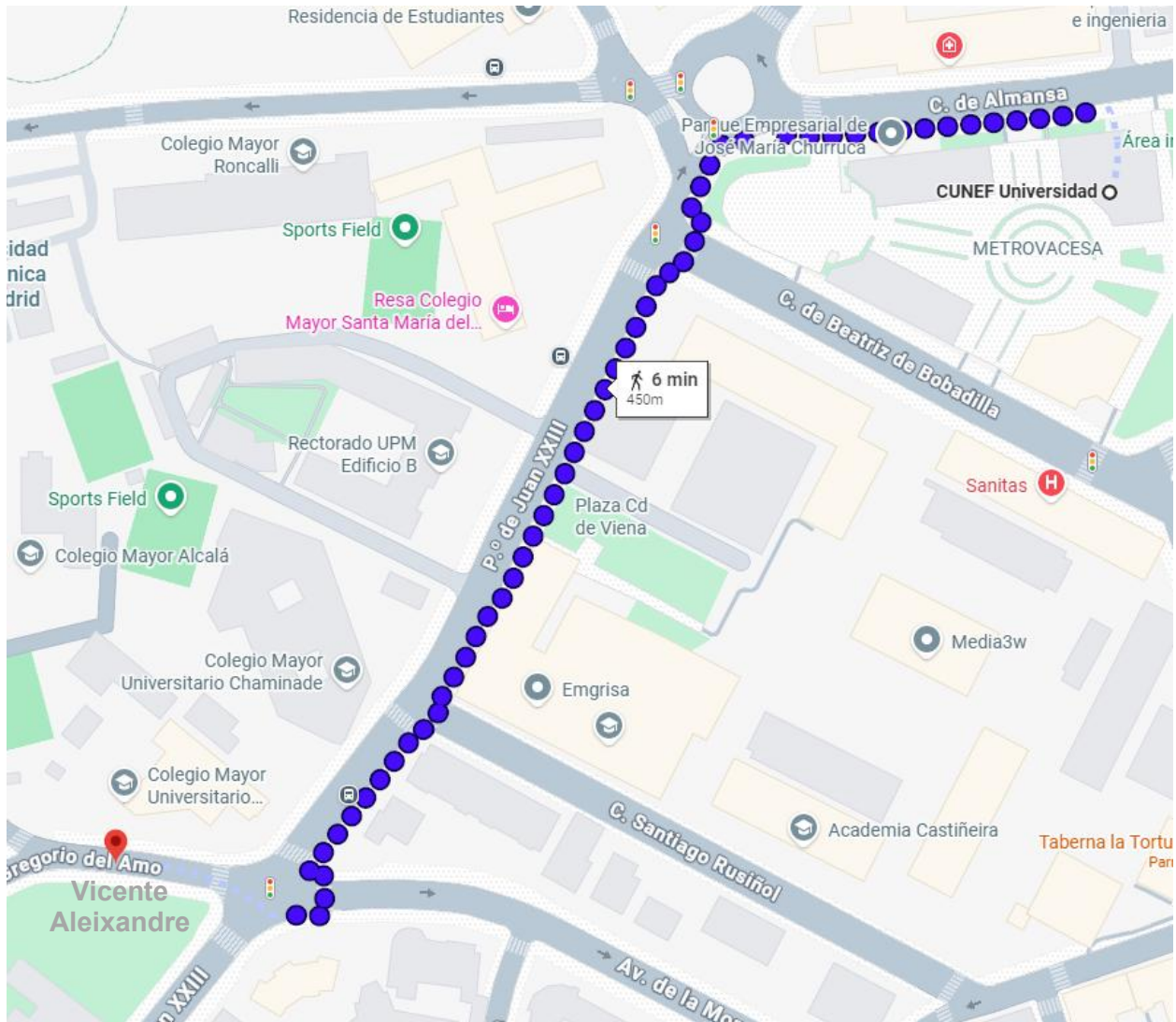
5. Getting from CUNEF Universidad to the city centre

CUNEF Universidad is approximately 30 minutes from the city centre (Puerta del Sol) by Metro. You can take line 6 (grey line) at **Vicente Aleixandre Station**, change to line 3 (yellow line) at **Moncloa Station**, and get off at **Sol Station**.



6. Getting from CUNEF Universidad to Vicente Aleixandre Metro Station

CUNEF Universidad's nearest Metro station is Vicente Aleixandre, a 6-minute walk away.

To use Metro de Madrid you need a **Public Transport Card (TTP)** loaded with a valid ticket for your journey. A **Single Ticket** must be used on the day of purchase. The TTP can hold up to two 10-journey tickets.

The TTP can be purchased from the ticket machines at all Metro stations and costs €2.50. The fare for a one-way ticket ranges from €1.50 to €2 (depending on the number of stations), plus a €3 airport supplement.
